Intake

Overview: Sessions are scheduled depending on participants availability.

Overview/intake: introducing participants to the program, structure and goals.

Conduct personalized assessments to identify participants needs and objectives- Ongoing

IDP (Individual Development Plan) – Develop plan to fit activities and hours. In consultation with Counselors. - Ongoing

Trainings and Workshops

PTE (Pathway to Employment): Employment Coach creates an appointment with client depending on availability. Employment coach support clients in job search process, provides guidance in resume, and interview preparation in making sure that participants have all tools for workforce.

ESL (English as a Second Language): Classes are via zoom and in the future, there will be opportunities in person in Saint Paul location. In the mornings Monday- Friday 10 A.M.-12 P.M. In the afternoon Monday- Thursday 6 P.M.- 8 P.M.

GED Prep: Designed to help individuals prepare for the GED exam paving the way for further education and career opportunities. Registration is required to secure a spot in the program. Classes are via zoom Tuesday mornings 10 A.M.-12 P.M. Vouchers are provided for participants to take GED test.

Computer Classes: Participants learn about and have the opportunity to earn NorthStar Digital Literacy Certificates in topics like: Basic computer skills, Internet, Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Email Social media. In Partnership With: St. Paul Public Library Spanish Speaking Community Liaisons on Fridays 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. via zoom and future in person classes.

Financial Literacy: Appointments are made depending on participants availability. In the sessions financial coach provides personalized coaching to address unique financial situation and objectives, budgeting strategies, debt management, and credit improvement.

Job Skills Training: Short term training such as commercial driver's license, team & hot water boilers license, phlebotomy certification, etc. for eligible participants.

Family and Community Engagement

Father Matters: At these guided meetings, participants will have the opportunity to talk about different topics: Parenting, children education and parent involvement, etc.

Personal Empowerment: Participants will learn about different topics that will prepare and give tools for personal empowerment. These workshops are meant to prepare participants to be Auto sufficient and to enter the workforce, these workshops are provided 1 workshop per quarter and is subject to change and vary depending on their needs.

Youth Programs

YA! (Youth in Action): Mentoring program for high school students. Program is open to Latinx high school students in and around Saint Paul and Minneapolis who are pursuing graduation and interested in college. Monthly meetings with coach.

Best Buy Teen Tech Center: Designed to help youth (ages 13-18) expand their interests and discover new career paths through technology- based projects. Program is free for youth to use.

Social Integration

Citizenship Classes: Registration is required. Classes are once a week on Monday's 6-8 P.M.

Voting Awareness: Information is sent via email with information about voting in Spanish. Link to how to vote is sent in Spanish to students.
